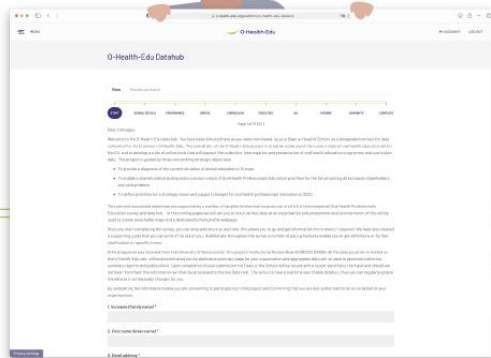

Introduction

Dear Colleague,

Welcome to the O-Health-Edu data hub. You have been directed here as you were nominated, by your Dean or Head of School, as a designated contact for data collection for the Erasmus + O-Health-Edu. The overall aim of the O-Health-Edu project is to better understand the current state of oral health education within the EU, and to develop a suite of online tools that will support the collection, interrogation and presentation of oral health education programme and curriculum data. The project is guided by three overarching strategic objectives:

- To provide a diagnosis of the current situation of dental education in Europe.
- To enable a shared understanding and a common vision of Oral Health Professionals' Education priorities for the future among all European stakeholders and policymakers
- To define priorities for a strategic vision and support changes for oral health professionals' education in 2030.

This aim and associated objectives are supported by a number of tangible Intellectual outputs one of which is this integrated Oral Health Professional's Education survey and data hub.
